FEB 28 BUSH AND BEACH WILDERNESS EXPERIENCE (B)

Sharing stories, cultural legends and the natural wonders of this living masterpiece and the history of the area. The highlight of your tour is an unrivalled boat trip through the spectacular Glowworm Grotto. Marvel at Mother Nature's light display as you glide silently through the starry wonderland of the Glowworm Grotto. Meander underground along the Waitomo River and gaze in silence at the myriad of glow worm lights that make up the Glowworm Grotto. TE Pō begins with our mouth-watering buffet with locally sourced cuisine and an authentic Māori twist in each dish. Following dinner, you will experience the exhilarating pōhiri (Ceremonial welcome) into our beautifully carved meeting house, Te Aronui a Rua. Enjoy the beauty and power of traditional

waiata (song), mōteatea (chants), poi and haka. Then travel into the geothermal valley on our e-waka (36-seat electric passenger shuttle) for a hot chocolate upon our naturally heated rock-seating overlooking the dramatically lit Pōhutu Geyser.

MAR 04 ROTORUA – TAUPO - NAPIER (B)

Today after breakfast, check out of the hotel and start our drive to Napier via Taupo.

From Rotorua you travel along the geothermal highway and past the edge of the largest man-made radiate pine forest in the world - the Kaingaroa Forest towards Taupō. Travel past Taupō which sits on the shores of New Zealand's largest lake, Lake Taupō. From Taupō you will travel over the Ahiminawa Ranges to Napier. Napier has the highest concentrations of Striped Classical, Spanish Mission and Art Deco building styles in the world. The commercial centre was completely rebuilt following a catastrophic earthquake in 1931. Napier is also at the centre of one of the largest and most vibrant wine-producing areas in New Zealand.

NAPIER/AHURIRI - the largest city in the Hawke's Bay, whose port handles the province's huge volumes of produce, spreads around the wedge of Bluff Hill, sometimes still referred to as "Scinde Island." Napier was almost completely surrounded by water before the severe 1931 earthquake flattened the city but uplifted vast areas of the surrounding seabed.

Today after breakfast, the group will be picked up for a wine tour at the Hawke's Bay.

On arrival at Dunedin airport, meet with your driver and transfer to Larnach Castle.



Larnach Castle | Castle & Garden Guided Tour

Discover New Zealand's only Castle, built 1871 by William Larnach, merchant baron and politician, for his beloved first wife Eliza. It took over 200 workmen three years to build the Castle shell and master European craftsmen spent a further

12 years embellishing the interior. Larnach spared no expense on his dream home, which features the finest materials from around the world.

Speight's Brewery Heritage Centre - Alehouse Dinner Package

An informative tour through the Speight's Brewery and Heritage Centre. During the Tour, you will see, touch, smell, and taste the ingredients going into making the legendary South Island Speight's beer. Learn the history of beer making, the brewing process, and how to make the traditional wooden beer casks. Today's tour is combined with a delicious 2-course Dinner at the Ale House right next door to the Speight's Brewery. Tour duration is 90 minutes and includes a two-course dinner.

DUNEDIN/OTEPOTI - often called the "Edinburgh of the South", Dunedin was settled by the Scottish settlers that came to New Zealand. It is a city of spires, of towers, gables and roofs with turrets, and gracious, generally stone, buildings. Dunedin is also home to the Albatross and Penguin colonies plus many species of New Zealand wildlife.

Accommodation: 2 nights at the **Distinction Dunedin Hotel** in a Studio Room including daily breakfast.

MAR 08**DUNEDIN****(B)**

Today we will enjoy a full day tour exploring Dunedin. **Dunedin City Sightseeing:** the Octagon, Otago University, the iconic Railway Station and Baldwin Street.

Otago Peninsula Eco Restoration Alliance | 90 Minute Guided Tour



Today's tour of OPERA (Otago Peninsula Eco Restoration Alliance) previously known as Penguin Place is an experience made possible by the conservation work done to ensure the future of the Yellow-eyed Penguin (one of the rarest and most endangered penguins in the world). Covered trenches and observation huts will keep you hidden so the penguins will not be frightened, and you can observe them going about their daily business in their natural habitat unperturbed by our presence.

The tour begins with an interactive talk educating our guests about the conservation work being done on the Otago Peninsula and especially about challenges of the Yellow eyed Penguin.

In addition to learning about the Yellow-eyed Penguin, guests have the opportunity to see these majestic birds up close in our rehabilitation center (when birds are in our care).

Royal Albatross Centre | Albatross Classic Tour



A unique, not to be missed chance to visit the world's only mainland breeding colony of magnificent Royal Albatross. Witness the fascinating social and family life of the breeding colony and have the chance to be awed by the soaring three metre (about 10') wingspan of the birds flying above. Visitors enjoy intimate insights into the amazing world of the Royal Albatross. Includes fully guided tour, short film, information on albatross breeding life cycle and colony viewing from our

exclusive observatory.

MAR 09**DUNEDIN – CHRISTCHURCH****(B)**

This morning after breakfast and check out of the hotel we will transfer by coach to Christchurch via Moeraki, Oamaru, Geraldine and Ashburton.

CHRISTCHURCH/OTAUTAHI - the Garden City, lies on the level plains that initially attracted the closely-knit Church of England settlers that settled the area. The largest of

the South Island cities, Christchurch retains something of the English nature of its origins - the willow and oak-lined River Avon and clustered mediaeval stone buildings.

Waka on Avon | Waka Paddle



Leaving from 794 Colombo Street opposite Victoria Square this 45-minute waka paddling experience is an amazing cultural journey of the Ōtākaro Avon River by waka. Experience the team and skill building of paddling a hand-crafted waka down the Ōtākaro River Avon and learn about the importance of the waka to the early Māori culture. Enjoy early stories of Canterbury's Ngāi Tahu Iwi and the earliest European settlers, and the positive things they achieved building the city of Christchurch together.

Waka have been paddled on the Ōtākaro Avon River as far back as the 1700 century. Māori sailed to Aotearoa New Zealand on Waka Hourua (double-hull sailing waka). Single-hull waka became an important part of the early transport days of Christchurch city with no roads and nothing but swamp, Māori and early settlers collaborated regularly to transport trading goods and equipment up and down the Ōtākaro Avon River.

MAR 11 CHRISTCHURCH – GREYMOUTH – FRANZ JOSEF (B/L)


This morning, you will be picked up by your driver and transferred to the Christchurch train station.

The Great Journeys of New Zealand - Rail | Tranz Alpine: Christchurch to Greymouth - SCENIC PLUS. Report to Christchurch Train Station 20 minutes prior to departure. Today you will board the TranzAlpine scenic train departing from one coast of New Zealand and arriving at the other. Your train journey is 223.8 kilometres long and takes just four and a half hours.

There are 16 tunnels, and 5 viaducts, the highest being the Staircase standing at 73 metres. From your carriage you'll see the fields of the Canterbury Plains, beautiful gorges and river valleys of the Waimakariri River. The spectacular Southern Alps and the lushness of Beech rain forest. An open-air viewing carriage allows you to get even closer to the stunning scenery and provides many opportunities to photograph your favourite spots. There's a lot to look forward to before arriving at your destination.

As part of your journey, you will also enjoy the Scenic Plus experience to invigorate all the senses! Feast your eyes on epic scenery while you savour regionally inspired cuisine paired with wine and beer all from the comfort of your luxurious seat – a hosted dining experience like no other. Quite simply, we have done everything we can to ensure you feel at peace as you sink back in your seat and soak up the scenery.

Highlights include:

- Staff assisted boarding and luggage check in Personalised and dedicated host service bringing the experience to life with local stories and insights.
- Regionally inspired cuisine paired with local wines to bring authentic flavours of the journey.

On arrival at Greymouth, meet with your driver and transfer to Franz Josef via Hokitika.

FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER/WAIAU - originally named Victoria, after Queen Victoria of England, geologist Julius Von Haast, renamed it, Franz Josef, after the current Emperor of his homeland, Austria. The Glacier is pale blue/green ice that has retreated and advanced many times over the years. A walk from the carpark to the Glacier terminal will give you some impressive views and an idea of the immense size of the Glacier itself. The township of Franz Josef is a small town based around the tourist and supply trade.

Accommodation: 2 nights at the **Scenic Hotel Franz Josef Glacier** in a Superior Room - Douglas Wing including daily breakfast.

MAR 12**FRANZ JOSEF****(B)**

There is a wide range of excursion/activity choices in Franz Josef. Because of this we decided to not include an excursion but to give you a full day free so you can plan your own experience. Perhaps you're an adventurer at heart and you've always wanted to do a Heli-Hike on a glacier, maybe you prefer to just take a helicopter to a glacier, touch the ice and head back or you want to keep your feet on the ground and hike the beautiful rainforest area. You can also stay in town and visit the local spa or relax in a hot tub. The day is yours to explore. If you want additional choices don't hesitate to reach out to me.



Optional Tours (with extra cost)*

1. Franz Josef Glacier Guides | Heli-Hike - Check in 15 minutes prior to departure.

Cost - \$499 per person (price subject to change)

With the combination of an exhilarating helicopter ride, jaw-dropping scenery and a two-and-half-hour hike through the most spectacular glacier features, it's no wonder guests often label their Glacier Heli Hike as the highlight of their visit to Aotearoa (New Zealand). Your journey starts and ends at The Helicopter Line Base, situated on the Main Road, Franz Josef. On arrival, the friendly team will check you in and prepare you for the excitement ahead with necessary gear and pre-trip briefings. From here, your guide will take you to the helipad and get you ready to board the helicopter. Adrenaline levels start to spike as you board and are whisked away over the jaw dropping landscape - an opportunity to take in the full panoramic majesty of Kā Roimata o Hine Hukatere nestled within the surrounding mountains. Your pilot will land high up on the main ice fall of the glacier, where your guide will help you make the final preparations for your hike. Then you will be ready to explore the pristine features of this incredible icescape. The guides are highly skilled, which means they can find you both the safest and most spectacular route available on the glacier. Because the glacier is so fast moving, its features are constantly changing - you might find yourself sliding through a narrow crevasse or between towering walls of ice, crawling through blue ice tunnels, hanging out in ice caves, or witnessing the glacier calving. You can be sure that you're seeing the glacier in a unique state and no two trips are ever quite the same. Whilst on this adventure, your guide will share with you the story of the Maori Legend, Kā Roimata o Hine Hukatere. Their knowledge of the glacier, surrounding area and insight on why Franz Josef is so unique; will leave you with a sense of awe. You will come away from your trip not only having experienced this majestic beauty, but a whole new understanding of their special and precious landmark.

Tour duration: Approx 4 hours - 2.5 hours on the ice/glacier.
Difficulty level: Moderate fitness is required.

2. **Glacier Valley Eco Tours | Franz Josef Nature Tour**

cost \$99 per person (price subject to change)

Explore the majestic West Coast temperate rainforest as you discover the Franz Josef Glacier valley - one of the lowest-lying and most unusual glaciers in the world. This tour is beautiful in blue skies or magical misty rain and you will feel like you are in Narnia or Lord of the Rings. At your own pace, wander past gorgeous glacial rivers and streams and through beautiful podocarp forests; discover hidden natural treasures such as wild mushrooms and dozens of species of orchids. Relish the sound of the native bird songs and waterfalls; spot a Chamois or a Tahr on the towering snow-capped mountains above while drinking a cup of tea. This eco-tour is suitable for all ages and abilities and is a great family-friendly experience.

3. **The Helicopter Line - Neve Discoverer**

The perfect opportunity to get up close to the glaciers and touch snow. You'll be captivated as you lift off and fly up and over the Franz Josef Glacier or Fox Glacier and experience the solitude of a landing in this natural alpine wonderland. (20minutes)

MAR 13

FRANZ JOSEF – WANAKA – QUEENSTOWN

(B)

This morning, we will leave Franz Josef and follow an ancient greenstone trail. View the sheer drop of Thunder Creek Falls and the grand sight of Mt Hooker, flanked on three sides by extensive glaciers.

Travel over Haast Pass, marking a change from the rainforest marvel of the wild West Coast to the alpine scenery of the Southern Lakes. From here you will travel further into Central Otago. View Lake Wanaka, where the shoreline is charmingly lined by poplars and willows, followed by the vivid blue waters of Lake Hawea. It is a day of gorgeous lakes, as after Hawea you will gravel over to Cromwell, situated next to the sparkling pristine waters of Lake Dunstan. Stop in at a local orchard for a taste of some of the town's delicious stone fruit then continue your journey to Queenstown, the adventure capital of New Zealand.

Skyline Queenstown - Gondola Ride



Take a scenic ride in the iconic Skyline Gondola and take in the stunning views as you ride the steepest cable car lift in the Southern Hemisphere!

QUEENSTOWN/TAHUNA - is the South Island's most popular resort, set alongside the shores of Lake Wakatipu, under the gaze of the Remarkables Ranges. See the contrast of smooth glacier rounded hills, and jagged mountain summits that reach high above the ancient ice floor. The town is renowned for its jet boating, bungee-jumping, skiing and awe-inspiring scenery. Local story has it, that the gold prospectors of the 19th century pronounced the town as "fit for any Queen", and so she was called Queenstown.

Accommodation: 1 night at the **Millenium Queenstown** in a Standard Room including breakfast.

MAR 14 DEPART QUEENSTOWN TO MELBOURNE (B)

This morning after breakfast and check out of the hotel, the group will be transferred to the airport for your onward flight. (Flight is not included and will be quoted separately) If you are not joining us in Australia your tour ends here but you can add extra nights in Queenstown.

MAR 14 MELBOURNE

Tipping is also not compulsory in Australia however it is more common to leave a tip when dining. It should be no more than 10% of the total bill. Typically you can just round up your bill. For all other services such as guides, it is appreciated but not expected. Our hotels in Australia will include portage.
